We are Becoming Disciples

¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt. 28:18-20 ESV)

"All authority in heaven and on earth...."

This is the authority of Jesus. Jesus possesses all authority in heaven and on earth. This is the authority of the one whom we want to be discipled by – by Jesus. When Pastor Donn reminds us Sunday by Sunday that 'we are becoming disciples,' he means that we are to be becoming Jesus' disciples; and Jesus possesses all authority in heaven and on earth. Infinitely more authority than Fox News. Infinitely more authority than The New York Times. Infinitely more authority than any other possible authority that can be named. To the extent that we are Biblically faithful – to that extent and only to that extent – what we learn from Scripture is backed by 'all authority in heaven and on earth...'

"Teaching them..."

It is a present tense participle. The sense is the repeated and continuing nature of the activity. Jesus is about teaching – repeatedly teaching – constantly teaching. Jesus tells us here that central to what we call '*The Great Commission'* – the greatest commission on earth – is teaching. It seems so mundane doesn't it – the teaching of Scripture that we do here week by week? Sermons. Sunday School lessons. Bible studies. Individual Bible reading. Teaching them. It was at the very heart of the life of Him who possessed 'all authority in heaven and on earth.'

"Teaching them to observe (keep) all that I commanded you..."

As the Puritan Super Star of the 17th century, John Owen, once expressed it 'we learn all to practice, and we learn much by practice.' We learn all to practice. We make disciples for the sake of practice - the practical daily following of Jesus - our following being shaped by Jesus' commandments and our obedience to them. The prayer is and must always be that preaching, and Sunday School lessons and Bible studies would be transformational. Not 24 hours transformational. Not 24 months transformational. But rather 24 years transformational. That over a lifetime of hearing and reading and listening and learning we find our lives fundamentally and largely shaped by the words and commands of Jesus. This is what we are to be about - this is what it means to say 'we are becoming disciples..."

"I will be with you always...."

The words of the Greek New Testament here are Hebraic in formulation. A 'woodenly literal' translation of the phrase would be 'I am with you all the days...' Jesus, who possesses all authority in heaven and on earth promises to walk with His people 'all the days... forever' That is the idea in the phrase. Jesus with us 'all the days.' Jesus with us on glorious days when we are hiking in a National Park, and Jesus with us on daunting days at the bedside of our father or mother. Jesus with us as we age and approach the end. Jesus with us as we rejoice at the birth of our first child. 'Always = all the days.'

We are becoming disciples.

This past year has brought some heavy burdens as we strive to guide and provide for them and point them to the One who can bring them purpose, hope and joy. In reflecting about the difficult journey that we are currently traveling, I have also been pondering Romans 8:32; what God the Father did for me in the spiritual realm does not compare to the physical burdens that I am currently carrying for my kids. God's compassion for me involves so much more than just providing salvation and I probably won't know the extent of it until He explains it all in heaven.

These are all exciting, busy activities that are squeezed into the normal work that needs to be accomplished of tackling next year's budget and preparing the accounting system so it is ready for the audit that is only a few months away.

We are so thankful this month for:

- Several short-term and mid-term missionaries who are scheduled to depart for the field in the next month,
- Our new landlord is gracious and easy to work with.
- Noelle is making progress in her program.
- For wisdom for SEND to clearly see where the Lord would have us locate next.
- That God would guide our family decisions to know where to live that would fit in our budget and to find appropriate school options that would prepare our youth for graduation/life.
- Two co-workers in the office who are struggling and need healing with serious health concerns,
- Guidance for the doctors to find a solution that would help Michael through the problems he has just experienced.
- That our teens will hunger and thirst for righteousness; desiring to know and live for Jesus.
- For our ongoing financial needs to be met and that God would touch more hearts to prayerfully and financially partner with us in this ministry. We are grateful that we have people like you who have been praying and supporting us. Your partnership is essential to this ministry of upholding the financial activities of over 500 missionaries who share about Jesus around the world and equip others to do the same.

Thank you for being part of our journey and praying for us; we are praying for you also as you face difficulties as well. We would love to know how we can pray for you specifically. Thank you for your support and encouragement!
